
Celebration of the Word - Faith

A reading from the Gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples, "I am the true vine and you are the branches. But just as a branch cannot produce fruit unless it remains joined to the vine, you cannot produce fruit unless you remain in me. Anyone who does not remain in me is like a branch that has been thrown away. But if you remain in me and my words remain in you, then you will produce much fruit to the glory of God."

Pope Francis said: "Faith is not a light that scatters all our darkness, but a lamp that guides the way."

Let's think about the word 'Faith'. Faith is believing in something even when we can't see it. It's like believing that the sun will rise every morning, even when it's hidden behind clouds.

Having faith is important because it gives us hope and courage, especially when things are difficult. It helps us believe that everything will be okay, even when we're worried or scared.

Faith also teaches us to be kind and caring to others. When we have faith, we trust that there is goodness in the world, and we want to spread that goodness to others.

Please use the template supplied for the drawing and words and submit to your class teacher on the first day back after the Easter holidays.

















