"In our school children, staff, parents and carers, governors and parish will work together to create a caring, learning environment with Our Lord as the focal point in which each child is valued as an individual, nurtured and encouraged to fulfil his/her potential." Parent Governor elections are next due in April 2019 but can be held sooner should the current governors step down.

We are keen to fill the current vacancy for a foundation governor. If you or anyone you know might be interested in fulfilling this vital governance role please contact the school to obtain further information.

Staff elections will be held early September to fill the Ms Patel's vacancy.

Associate Governors do not have voting rights but bring a lot of knowledge and skills and provide valuable advice and guidance. Grace Husey will be stepping down at the end of the year and we thank her for input over the year. If you feel you have any specialist skills that you could bring to the Governing Boy please contact the school and we would be happy to discuss it with you.

Following the Ofsted inspection in spring 2015 it was recommended the Governors have an independent review, one of the suggestions was that we re-organise our committee structure. So we undertook the structuring at the start of the school year and now have <u>two sub-committees:</u>

- Resources Committee
- <u>School Improvement Committee</u>

The Resources Committee looks after all matters to do with Finance, Premises, Health and Safety and HR. It looks after the school's budget and approves major spending. The budget is currently showing a deficit for the financial year 2016/17 but this is offset by a surplus being brought forward from last year. This is unlikely to be possible in future years and austerity continues to bite and so the Governors have approved changes proposed by the Head Teacher regarding a re-structuring of the school's staffing structure. The Governors also approved the letting of a new contract for the provision of catering services.

The School Improvement Committee looks after Curriculum, Admissions, Performance and Outcomes. The School Improvement Committee will monitor the introduction of the new curriculum and have been busy updating the School's Admissions policy. This committee also keeps a close eye on pupil attainments, which was the main area of concern in the Ofsted Report and it is good to know there have been significant progress in this area following a lot of hard work on the part of the Head teacher and his staff.

As well as attending full Governing Body meetings, Governors attend one or both of the sub committees and also have other individual responsibilities such as health and Safety coordinator, Safeguarding and SEN (special educational needs).

Governors also have designated link roles; such as literacy link, maths link and safeguarding and regularly visit the school for updates related to their individual link topics which then report back to the governing body.

Governors also attend various training courses throughout the year, some held at the Haringey professional development centre and other bespoke sessions held just for us at the school. Among the topics covered have been safeguarding, pupil premium.

Among their many activities during the year, Governors attended the health and safety walk rounds / audit and also reviewed and approved a raft of new policies on such things as HR, SEN, pay, equality, etc. as well as having an input to the School Development plan and self evaluation form. All Governors are required to be DBS checked.

Finally not only do we want to thank all the staff for their excellent work in enabling our children to achieve fantastic end of year results; particularly with in light of the changes introduced with new curriculum and

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marking regime for SATs. We would also like to thank the Friends of SJV for all their great work throughout the year in putting on fun and enriching events for the children and parents.

We hope you all enjoy the summer break and look forward to seeing you all again in September.
