I know that time is precious and we are all busy, so I am grateful for your participation and your positive feedback. It was a very disappointing turnout, however, and I am keen to understand ways in which we can better communicate with the parent community. Evenings don't suit everyone. Neither do mornings or afternoons, which gives the school a logistical challenge. It is one we are happy to work with, if we feel we can improve involvement.

I don't believe there is apathy; I know that you care about the way in which the school is run and its plans for the future. I know that you have ideas for improvement and I know that from time to time, you will have specific concerns. I am determined that this is all funnelled through official, yet informal, channels, rather than allowing ideas, issues and uncertainties to simply swirl around.

I know, too, that many of you are happy with the school and don't feel the need to engage – which is absolutely fine.

Meetings such as last Wednesday's are an ideal way of creating this information rich environment. In addition, my previous appeal for class representatives to take part in a regular 'Parent Voice' forum did not gain any traction.

School Uniform

It has come to our attention lately that certain items of school uniform are slipping. it is important that we all observe the uniform requirements; it is central to our identity and togetherness. In particular, I must remind you of:

- **School shoes**: must be black, plain (NO logos or branding) and must not go over the ankle. Boots are not part of school uniform.
- School tie: compulsory for KS2, optional for EYFS and KS1

Children are welcome to wear boots to school in the winter months, and they may wear trainers before school at break times to play sports, but they **must change into regulation school shoes** for the school day.



Everyone was impressed with their knowledge and politeness and we all even managed a turn in the driver's seat!


The story made it to the local newspapers (as far as Enfield, meaning I could read about our brilliant children over my cornflakes this morning!), so keep an eye out.
