KS2 SATs (Year 6) - Meeting Expected Standard

At the end of KS2, children are required to undertake externally marked public examinations called SATs. Last year and this year, the tests have been much tougher, reflecting the more challenging 2014 National Curriculum expectations. As you can see, the staff and children of SJV have more than risen to that challenge!

At the end of Year 2, children take internally marked tests, which are used to confirm or refine the Teacher's own assessments. Again, the tests are more challenging in recent years, and again the results are fantastic.

At the end of Year 1, the Government require that all pupils take a 'Phonics Screening' test – this is NOT a reading test (it does not check understanding), but it ensure that children have the basic skills with which to tackle words when reading. Another amazing outcome.

At the end of Reception Class (Early Years), children are assessed across a number of criteria, including reading, writing and maths, which determine whether or not they have reached a Good Level of Development. For the second year running, our children have exceeded national averages.

Uniform Reminder
