St. John Vianney School has a long and proud connection with Chinziri Primary school in Malawi.

In the recent past, we have helped provide infrastructure, basics such as roofing and much needed equipment for learning.

Fr. Henry tells us that, this year, the money will be used to help build a house for a 4th teacher at the everexpanding school, as well as lamps for working at night (!) and the continued feeding programme.

We have been with the school every step of the way, and are proud that we play a small part in education of some 600 pupils in another continent.

Pupils and their families have raised money all year via cake sales, Red Nose Day, Year 6's Bugsy performance and Movie Nights. One pupil even donated some money he found on the way back from swimming – every little helps!
