General Reminders from the School Office:

- Dinner Money Children in Key Stage 2 are required to pay for school lunches. It is £2.50 per day, £12.50 per week. Lunch Money must be paid on time, it is not acceptable to be in arrears with payment. Please do not wait for a reminder.
- Free School Meals If your circumstances change and you may be entitled to FSM then please ask the office for a form. Likewise if you are on FSM and your circumstances change (i.e. you start working) please inform the office immediately.
- Medical Appointments Please can I remind parents that appointments during the school day should be avoided wherever possible and that the school require a copy of the appointment letter for our records.


