


Normal Service is Resumed...

Notices and Reminders

Outstanding Dinner Money ~ Please <u>do not</u> wait for a reminder to pay outstanding dinner money. If your child has school lunches, payment of £12.50 (£2.50 per day) is due at the <u>beginning of each week</u>. If you have an issue with payment please speak to the office staff.

Payment of Breakfast Club Money ~ Please be aware that payment for breakfast club must be paid two weeks in advance. Please do not wait for a reminder to pay. If you have an issue with payment please speak to the office staff.

Lost Property ~ once again our lost property bins are overflowing with unnamed uniform, PE kit, gloves, hats, etc. **PLEASE** name your children's clothes. Any unclaimed lost property will be sold at the next cake sale. Proceeds will go to our Malawi school fund.

Absence from school ~ If your child cannot attend school for any reason telephone the school office BEFORE 8.30am. When your child returns to school please send a note to the class teacher, on the first day back, explaining the

absence. Unexplained absence may result in an unauthorised absence being recorded.

Vomiting and Sickness ~ If your child is absent from school or has been sent home because she/he has been vomiting or had diarrhoea the child must stay at home for <u>48 hours after their last bout of illness</u>. These are guidelines sent to the school from the local authority and must be adhered to.

SJV Goes Potty for World Book Day




"The Boy Who Lived..."


