This week, some of you have shared your concern and horror about some of the anti-social behaviour that is happening around our perimeter – front and back. I have personally had to clear up the area alongside our football pitch this week, and have been disgusted by what I have had to pick up. I have had reports from parents about suspicious dealings near to the school, and this morning we removed a discarded bag of drugs, literally from the entrance to our school.

We have reported our growing concerns, numerous times, via 101, 999 and to the Local Authority, and still nothing tangible has changed.

We are a school, and we carry a precious commodity – we cannot wait until something serious happens for those that are charged with protecting us to act.

I am asking you all to lend your voices to ours, and to our local, law-abiding residents. Report what you see; report your concerns; report it to the police and to the Local Authority. Help us to make this area and this school a safe, vibrant place in which to live and learn. We do not ask for much in asking for this.

Reminders

Please remember: if your child has been sick, or has had diarrhoea, they need to stay off 48 hours **after**, so that the issue has had a full chance to clear. Returning your child too early, as has happened recently, puts others at risk of sickness – you can imagine how quickly a problem like this spreads in our environment.
