Seeing and sharing scary things online

(advice from London Grid for Learning Safeguarding Team..)

Keeping children safe is a top priority at SJV whether on school premises or beyond, and this of course extends to the online world (although actually our online and offline lives are so blurred that it's not always helpful to use this distinction).

Online safety or digital resilience is a whole-school effort: it is embedded throughout the curriculum and of course, it is very much part of our safeguarding focus given the real risks and dangers which exist online.

In all we do, however, we like to focus on the positives of the online world. We recognise that technology is here to stay and pupils at our school live, love and learn through their tech.

What we would like to encourage you to do, though, is to talk to your children about what they get up to online.

Please take time to talk to them over the next few weeks about what they do on their devices and with whom, what they love, and what worries them. Why not get them to show or teach you how to use one of their apps, sites or games? The key thing is to stay positive, be real about the risks and make sure they know who they can talk to if they are unsure.

There are plenty of things to be aware of online (I have shared Police advice with you this week, for example, and there have been many news stories) and if you are warning them about risks and dangers, avoid showing them scary images or telling them the names of 'bad apps' (all apps can be good or bad) or challenges/dares to avoid.

The message is: if you see something that you are not comfortable with – ask an adult for help.
