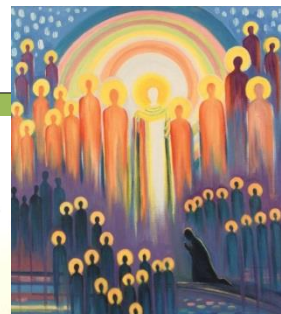
Saints in the Making

Sitting in the big swivelly chair is all very well when there are no children in the building, but you try running the school on a day when there's wet play and the boiler stops working!

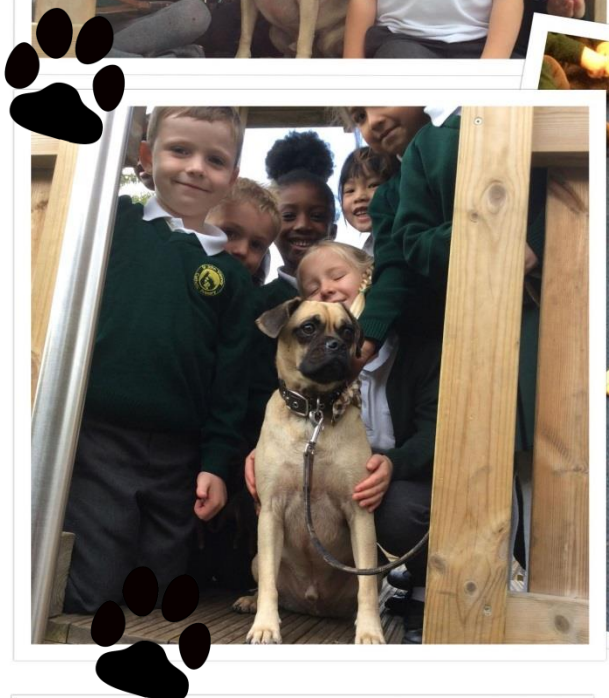
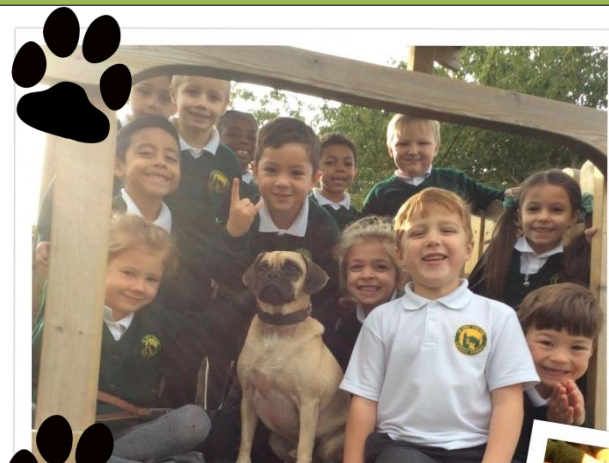
TO be fair, the office was much tidier than when I left it, so it was not all bad!

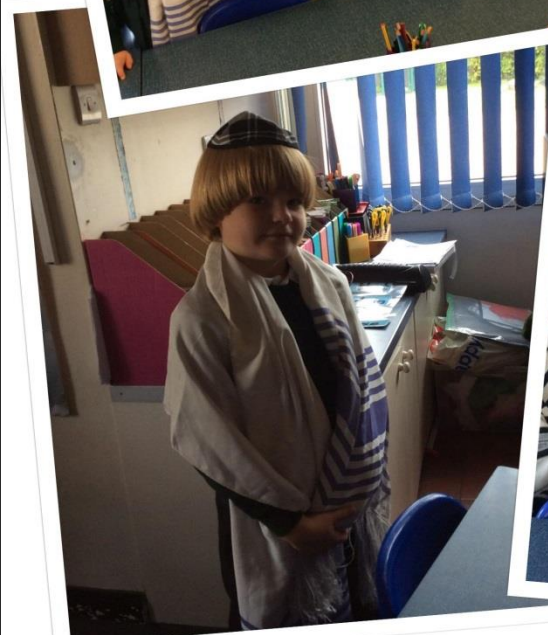

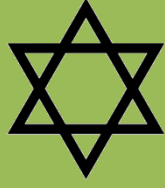

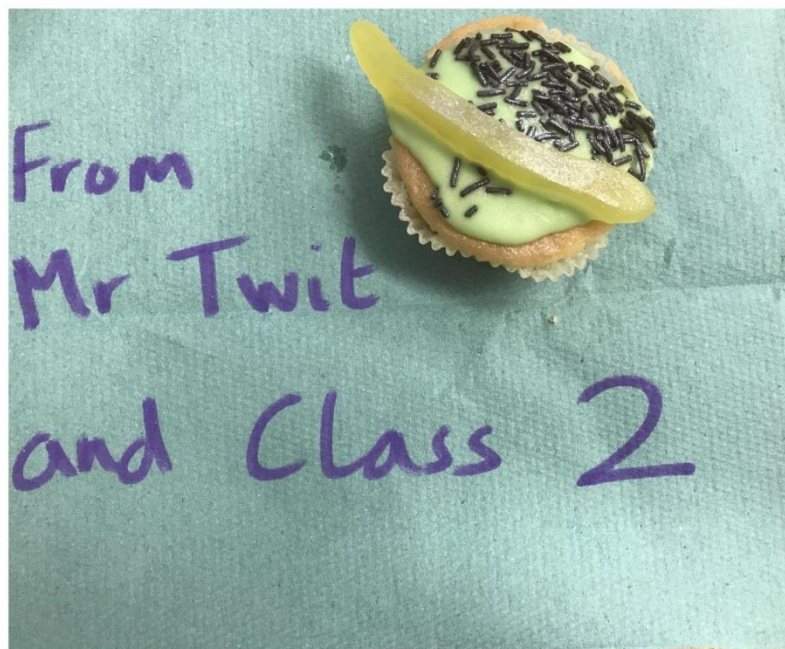
Autumn Fun in Nursery: Making the most of the weakening Autumn sunshine, Nursery got themselves outside for some fresh air and some close up fun with nature!
