It's been a busy week! Lots of trips, a charity day, governors' meetings and...a very special visitor indeed graced our Tottenham Hotspur curriculum day!






Sponsored Read at SJV

Consultation on our proposed admission arrangements 2021/2022 of St John Vianney Catholic Primary School

The governing body of *St John Vianney Catholic Primary School* invites you to view the proposed admissions policy for 2021/2022 as well as the Supplementary Information Form (SIF) 2021/2022.

These documents are out for consultation for 6 weeks commencing on 6^{th} November 2019 and will close on 18^{th} December 2019.

We are seeking feedback on the following changes:

- 1. Adding new criterion 5, "Non-Catholic children who have a sibling at the school at the time of admission";
 - **<u>Rationale:</u>** To ensure that our non-Catholic families are able to stay together in one school.
- 2. **Amending criterion 6 from**, "Children of catechumens and members of an Eastern Christian Church"

To: "Children of catechumens and members of an Eastern Christian Church whose application is supported by a certificate of baptism".

Rationale: To confirm that the children are members of their Church.

All other criteria remain the same as in previous years.

The proposed Admissions Policy and SIF are available on the school website. You may wish to contact the school for a hard copy of the admission arrangements which you can collect or which can be posted to you.

We invite you to send your responses to these proposals directly to Mrs G. Alfonso, School Business Manager, St John Vianney Catholic Primary School, Stanley Road, Tottenham, London, N15 3HD, by 18th December 2019 for the governing body to consider.
