Practicalities – Key Worker Support

We now have more guidance from the department of Education. We are fully committed to supporting this initiative **but** need all parents to follow the guidelines.

The government has asked us to remain open, if possible, **only for those children who absolutely need to attend.**

I must emphasise - DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL UNLESS

- a) YOU ARE CLEARLY A KEY WORKER AND
- b) HAVE ABSOLUTELY NO ALTERNATIVE

If you are able to make your own childcare arrangements, then you must (NB: advice is to NOT leave them with elderly relatives).

Our staff, who are key workers themselves it must be remembered, are ready and willing to support frontline workers in this nationwide response, so please consider all options carefully.

If you have not registered, AND received confirmation from the school, by the end of Saturday 21st, your child will not be permitted to attend on Monday 23rd.
