Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been a week now since the Government announced its 'ambition' to open Primary Schools to a wider number of pupils, beginning in June.

The cohorts chosen to start with caught us all by surprise, and has caused a great deal of debate in the days following amongst parents, staff, governors, political parties and unions. The debate continues. The 'guidance' continues to trickle in...

I will restate what our position has been all along – we will prioritise the safety of the children, staff and their wider families above all else. We have canvassed parents and staff, discussed with Governors and there is considerable consensus on the school's position of prioritising safety, and that is comforting to know. I know how concerned you all are about returning in this climate. I am aware, that some of you need surety about returning to work.

We know, also, that we need to start planning how we can make our schools safe in the short, medium and long term <u>now</u>. This is not an issue than be left, lock, stock and barrel, to be dealt with in September. In September, we need to be strong; confident that we are able to welcome children and staff back into a familiar-but-different school.

We are still working through the details and the guidance, but I think it is important to note that what we plan this side of the Summer holidays will be calm, measured, phased and geared towards:

- Safe reintegration safe for children, safe for staff; this will increase...
- Staff confidence,
- Parent confidence

Taken at face value, the Government's ambition of having four year groups arrive back in June, along with the rest of the school by July, I think, does not achieve any of the above, nor will it allow me to assure safety; not to you, the parents, and not to the staff.

We will be gathering further information from selected parents about their intentions, and we will be working hard to ensure that we can assist our community to leave lockdown behind safely and confidently, and will have more to communicate on this in the coming week.

In the meantime, have a restful and blessed weekend.
