
# St John Vianney Catholic School School Newsletter

### **Important reminders:**

In order to ensure the safety of all and the continued operation of the school, I am asking you all to pay special attention to the following two points:

## 1) Please DO NOT send your child to school if they are unwell <u>IN</u> ANY WAY AT ALL.

- If they have 'sniffles', sore throat, headache, tummy ache, are sneezing or ANY other symptom that means they are not 100% - you must keep them at home until they are 100% better.
- Now is the time to err on the side of caution.
- IF they have any of the Covid-19 symptoms, then you MUST keep them at home, book a test and notify the school that you have done this.

#### **Covid Symptoms**

- A) High temperature (38 degrees and above)
- B) A continuous cough
- C) A change in your sense of taste or smell
- IF YOU ARE UNSURE ABOUT ANY SYMPTOMS, SEEK MEDICAL ADVICE OR CALL 111

# 2) Please observe STRICT SOCIAL DISTANCING when dropping off and picking up children.

- Please ensure that you turn up on time too early or too late invalidates the idea behind a staggered start/end
- Please leave promptly after collection
- Please stay 2m clear of all other parents, children and adults
- Drop off / Pick up is an incredibly sensitive time and your patience and understanding is essential – please do not question staff or challenge them on routines and arrangements – be assured, they have been carefully thought through.

### **Nursey & Reception Siblings**

Parents who have children in Nursery or Reception must not use these gates for older siblings.

Older siblings must be brought to the main gates. They can be dropped off at the same time as their younger siblings but they must not enter through the Early Years.

This is for health and safety reasons, and to ensure that children are properly supervised while waiting in the playground.
