## **Dangerous Parking and Driving**

Unfortunately, a number of parents have reported issues with inconsiderate parking and driving around the Stanley Road car park entrance.

PLEASE -

- Do not park on the double yellow lines outside the school AT ANY TIME. They are there for a reason – to keep us all safe.
- Please take extra caution when manoeuvring your car along Stanley Road. The pedestrian traffic has increased significantly, and you must be more aware. AVOID REVERSING – this is a particular danger.

Also...

- Please do not stand or wait in the road outside the gates for your children, and
- Please DO NOT allow your child to run across Stanley Road, or cross by themselves, at drop off or pick up time

### Important – Drop off and Pick Up

At the start of the year we introduced staggered start times to help with social distancing.

Please make sure you arrive at school promptly.

On wet days, siblings are allowed to wait in the hall in year group bubbles. Unfortunately, due to social distancing, we do not have the space to allow all children who arrive early to wait inside. The main gates will only be open at 8:45, 9am and 9:15. Please come to school at your allocated time."

We will not be amending our routines, which are there for the continued safety of all, because it is raining. We appreciate it is not pleasant to have to wait in the rain, but ask that parents are prompt to minimise any inconvenience.

# **Notes and Information**


**Flu vaccinations** - these are now taking place on Tuesday 13th October. Please return the consent forms by Monday morning regardless of whether you wish your child to have the vaccination or not.

### **Important reminders:**

Once again, please ensure that you are doing everything you can about keeping possible Covid-19 symptoms away from school.

#### 1) Please DO NOT send your child to school if they are unwell

 If they do not have symptoms of Covid-19, but have been unwell, you must still wait until they are fully better before you send them back to school.

#### 2) Please be vigilant for symptoms of Covid-19

• IF they have any of the 3 Covid-19 symptoms, then you MUST keep them at home, <u>book a test</u> and notify the school that you have done this.

#### **Covid Symptoms**

- A) High temperature (37.8 degrees and above).
- B) A continuous cough (coughing a lot for an hour).
- C) A change in your sense of taste or smell.
- IF YOU ARE UNSURE ABOUT ANY SYMPTOMS, SEEK MEDICAL ADVICE OR CALL 111.

#### 3) The Importance of being Tested

- If your child has one of the above IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU BOOK A TEST.
- Failure to do this means a) they cannot return to school for a further 10 days and b) we are unable to manage the possible risk of infection to other children and staff in their bubble.
- If you have difficulty booking a test, please keep trying until you get one please let the school know if you are unable to.
- Waiting for 10 days is NOT an option your child may be missing schooling unnecessarily.

# 4) Please observe STRICT SOCIAL DISTANCING when dropping off and picking up children.

- This has been identified as a key risk in the transmission of Covid-19 in the return of children to full schooling.
- Please do everything you can to observe this.


