In this time, we make room in our hearts and lives to let Jesus in and today our Year 4 class helped us do just that.


They lit the first candle on our advent wreath and read the Gospel relating to the Annunciation.


They read beautifully and, in a year like no other, they set the scene for the great work we must do to prepare for Christmas!

If you, or anyone you know, is looking for a school place in September 2021, please contact the school office and book yourself onto one of these sessions.



I also nominate M for always showing a good attitude towards her work across all subjects. She is always helping and supporting others. The signs of a great friend.




