

The work that is being done at home and at school is amazing, and it is this attitude and hard work that we will get through all of this.


Teachers are reporting FULL attendance at some Zoom sessions and some brilliant work being submitted. This routine is important, and we hope that you can keep it up.

Stay at Home

The government's clear advice at present is that everyone should stay at home if they can. **Even if you or your partner are Key Workers**, your child should stay home if you are able to care for them. Please **DO** Not apply for or keep a Key Worker place if you are not a Critical Key Worker, central to the nation's response to Covid-19.

Staffing and Management

Our Assistant Headteacher, Mr. Quin, has decided to step back from management duties for the time being. I'd like to thank him for his invaluable input and assistance over the last couple of year in that role. His contribution to the development of our school in that time has been amazing. Of course, his role as class teacher and a Writing Champion at our school are unaffected.

Following on from this, I am delighted to share with you that Ms Donald, our Inclusion Manager has been appointed Acting Assistant Headteacher for the balance of the year. I am sure you will join me in wishing her the very best in this role.



Important reminders:

Once again, please ensure that you are doing everything you can about keeping possible Covid-19 symptoms away from school.

1) Please DO NOT send your child to school if they are unwell

 If they do not have symptoms of Covid-19, but have been unwell, you must still wait until they are fully better before you send them back to school.

2) Please be vigilant for symptoms of Covid-19

• **IF they have any of the 3 Covid-19 symptoms**, then you MUST keep them at home, <u>book a test</u> and notify the school that you have done this.

Covid Symptoms

- A) High temperature (37.8 degrees and above).
- B) A continuous cough (coughing a lot for an hour).
- C) A change in your sense of taste or smell.
- IF YOU ARE UNSURE ABOUT ANY SYMPTOMS, SEEK MEDICAL ADVICE OR CALL 111.

3) The Importance of being Tested

- If your child has one of the above IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU BOOK A TEST.
- Failure to do this means a) they cannot return to school for a further 10 days and b) we are unable to manage the possible risk of infection to other children and staff in their bubble.
- If you have difficulty booking a test, please keep trying until you get one please let the school know if you are unable to.
- Waiting for 10 days is NOT an option your child may be missing schooling unnecessarily.

4) Please observe STRICT SOCIAL DISTANCING when dropping off and picking up children.

- This has been identified as a key risk in the transmission of Covid-19 in the return of children to full schooling.
- Please do everything you can to observe this.

I would also like to nominate A, she is always taking an active role in our Zoom lessons and is sharing lots of her great ideas. Well done!






