


Pope Francis said: "Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching the little ones how to follow Jesus."

Important reminders:

Once again, please ensure that you are doing everything you can about keeping possible Covid-19 symptoms away from school.

1) Please DO NOT send your child to school if they are unwell

 If they do not have symptoms of Covid-19, but have been unwell, you must still wait until they are fully better before you send them back to school.

2) Please be vigilant for symptoms of Covid-19

 IF they have any of the 3 Covid-19 symptoms, then you MUST keep them at home, <u>book a test</u> and notify the school that you have done this.

Covid Symptoms

- A) High temperature (37.8 degrees and above).
- B) A continuous cough (coughing a lot for an hour).
- C) A change in your sense of taste or smell.
- IF YOU ARE UNSURE ABOUT ANY SYMPTOMS, SEEK MEDICAL ADVICE OR CALL 111.

3) The Importance of being Tested

- If your child has one of the above IT IS IMPORTANT THAT YOU BOOK A TEST.
- Failure to do this means a) they cannot return to school for a further 10 days and b) we are unable to manage the possible risk of infection to other children and staff in their bubble.
- If you have difficulty booking a test, please keep trying until you get one please let the school know if you are unable to.
- Waiting for 10 days is NOT an option your child may be missing schooling unnecessarily.

4) Please observe STRICT SOCIAL DISTANCING when dropping off and picking up children.

- This has been identified as a key risk in the transmission of Covid-19 in the return of children to full schooling.
- Please do everything you can to observe this.

Face Coverings at Drop Off and Pick Up

- As we have previously requested, can we ask that face coverings are worn at drop off and
 pick up please. While we collectively make every effort to avoid gathering by staggering
 times, inevitably there may be occasions when we are unable to distance and face
 coverings are there to add some protection for the benefit of all.
- Having said that, I know that we are in a period of heightened anxiety and stress and I want
 to urge us all to show understanding and consideration towards one another. I would much
 rather that any frustrations that you may have with the actions of others is dealt with
 constructively via us. Often we are best placed to help resolve issues amicably.
- Our strength is our community we work for each other and support each other and I
 know that we can re-double our efforts to mutually support each other back to more
 normal times.


The last day of the Summer Term is Friday 23rd July.













If you would like to take part draw an outline of your favourite minibeast, insect, bird, or flower on the


