Notices & Reminders

- Nursery Applications packs for a January 2022 start are now ready for collection from the school office for children turning 3 this autumn.
- Umbrellas: Children should not bring umbrellas into school: we do not have the space to store them and they are a potential hazard, with dripping water and pointed parts.
- A good hooded coat is required for the winter months. If your child uses an umbrella to and from school, please take it from them in the morning and bring it for them in the afternoon.

Years 1, 2, 3 and 4 Collection: Once again, thank you all for your cooperation at collection time. We were 'clear' within 10 minutes yesterday, which is fantastic. Remember:

- All classes (with siblings going with the youngest) lined up in the playground at 3:25
- Class 1 parents line up first (please DO NOT line up until your class is called – this causes unnecessary delay).
- Once class 1 has gone, class 2 will be dismissed and so on.
- PLEASE ensure that you are on time, ready to collect at 3:25. Being prompt makes all the difference.

Notices & Reminders

- Safeguarding & Collection: Children being collected from school by a different adult - Where possible please notify the class teacher in writing before the start of the school day.
- Contact Forms: Emergency Contact Forms: Please return by Monday as the deadline has already passed.
- Lost property the box is already nearly full please label clothing clearly with a permanent marker

Covid Reminders

If your chid has any of the three symptoms, they must isolate and get a PCR test.

They should not return to school until the PCR test has confirmed negative (even if they feel better the next day).

The most common symptoms associated with covid remain:

- A high temperature, or
- A new continuous cough or
- A loss of sense of smell

Please help us keep transmission in our community to an absolute minimum by supporting us in this matter.

Covid outbreak contingency plan - September 2021

When should my child self-isolate or miss school?



- All children MUST attend school unless they are ill.
- From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid.
- Instead, they will need to book a PCR test, but can <u>continue</u> coming to school, as long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative.





- If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at</u> <u>home</u> and should book a PCR test, <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow test.
- If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test.
- If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. The
 rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18
 or fully vaccinated but instead should book a PCr test.

Community Covid Risk

Description

Actions



Low community transmission No school cases

- There have been no cases of Covid within school for 10 school days
- Cases of Covid locally are low and/ or stable
- Hospitalisation/ deaths due to Covid nationally are low

No Covid measures are necessary beyond:

- reminding children of good hand-hygiene;
- ensuring 'catch it/bin it/kill it' is embedded;
- ensuring good ventilation encouraged where practical;
- ensuring children / staff stay at home if they have Covid symptoms (and book a PCR test).

Staff will continue to test themselves using lateral flow tests until the end of September.



Rapidly rising community transmission

- No current Covid cases have been recorded at school; however:
- cases of Covid are rising rapidly in the community causing disruption to other local schools.
- Haringey Public Health / Public Health England issue warnings of expected local/ national infection wave.

- ventilation of classrooms increased and handwashing is supervised;
- large indoor public performance audience numbers reduced (assemblies);
- staffroom capacity is reduced

- The child self-isolates for 10 days. Remote learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete it, as per school policy.
- The parents of the child are contacted directly by NHS Track and Trace to establish likely contacts.
- Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS
 Track & Trace and advised to book a PCR
 test. The school will contact parents to advise this if close contacts are known.
- Children do not need to miss school or selfisolate whilst they wait for the result of the PCR test unless they have Covid Symptoms.



5 children or staff within a year group test positive within 10 days of each other.

OR

3 children or staff in a single Class within 10 days.

- As above for each positive case.
- The school will discuss the outbreak with Haringey Public Health and agree strengthening protective measures for 10 school days, including:
 - adapting, limiting or postponing indoor sporting events, trips, open days and performances



Covid cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10 day period.

- Despite the measures indicated above, Covid cases within the school continue to rise within a 10 day period with multiple classes and staff affected, suggesting that Covid is spreading widely throughout the school.
- Incident Management Team meeting held between the school and Haringey Public Health to agree further measures, <u>for a</u> further 10 school days, including:
 - o re-introducing class bubbles;
 - limiting all non-essential visitors to school;
 - postponing all non-essential events;
 - re-introducing remote learning for individual classes for 10 school days considered, as per school policy.

The school will inform parents of any changes to Covid measures should these be needed.

Community Notice

Peace and Wellness festival to be hosted in the St Ann's Peace Garden, Harringay on **Saturday 25 September 12pm – 6pm**.

The event is part of a programme that Catalyst is carrying out to involve the local community in shaping the proposals for how the retained buildings and open spaces on the site will be used in the interim.

Catalyst was selected by the Greater London Authority to develop two thirds of the former St Ann's Hospital site. If you would like to find out more about Catalyst's involvement at St Ann's, please visit <u>Catalyst Online Consultation</u> <u>Platform (chg.org.uk)</u>.

We have established an Interim Uses Working Group; a team of local people who are volunteering with us and who bring diversity of experience, expertise, local knowledge and insight to inform the interim use proposals. The Group have planned this **Peace and Wellness Festival** to celebrate International Peace Day by bringing the local community together to explore and enjoy the site whilst contributing to the interim use proposals.

This community event will be open to all and people can drop-in throughout. Activities will be themed around peace and wellness reflecting the site's history as a former hospital.

As part of the event, there will be timed walking tours of some of the Victorian buildings which people can book onto in advance and on the day.

At the event there'll be an interim uses survey so that people can provide their feedback and contributions about the kind of interim uses that they would like to see happening across the site. This survey will also be online throughout September.
