Buddy Reading Programme






Embedded and loved by everyone! This programme keeps going from strength to strength!

KS1 Historians starting to understand that societies are governed by rulers, starting their knowledge with Kings & Queens of the UK





Art & Design – everyone's favourite! And why not? Learning skills, techniques and about the lives and work of incredible artists, the children have a rich experience in this subject.















Reception




